


FINDING A MATERIAL SAFETY DATA SHEET (MSDS)

Step 1 Login to ChemFFX

Go to: <http://safety.unimelb.edu.au/unimelb-only/chemffx.html> [University network login required]

Step 2 Choose Type of MSDS from the menu at left




1. Gold MSDS
Extensive MSDS from ChemWatch in multiple languages

2. Vendor's MSDS
MSDS exactly as provided by the manufacturer/ supplier – meets compliance requirements

3. Mini MSDS
Concise graphical MSDS from ChemWatch, colour-coded by risk level, in multiple languages


Step 3 Search for the chemical's name by Name/CAS No, then click **Search**


Step 4 Select the desired MSDS by clicking its title in the search results
